
#### **Discover the Seasons Week 2**

This week we crochet 4 blocks, 3 small ones of 10stx10r and 1 large one of 30st x 30r. Because you can't show much pattern on 10 stitches have I used each color for his own stitch. At this way you create some rest in your blanket. Below an overview from each color used at each stitch.

Color A	TSS	Tunisian Simple stitch
Color B	TKS	Tunisian Knit Stitch
Color C	TPS	Tunisian Purled Stitch
Color D	TTKS	Tunisian Twisted Knit Stitch

You crochet 10 rows and then the closing Row. You make your knot in the same stitch as connection stitch of row 10.



## Block 3 10x10 Color D

This block will bemade on block 2 and next to block 1. Count 10 row out on block 1, mark this point again with a stitchmarker. Now count 10 stitches **from the right upper corner from block 2**. Attach in the 11th stitch with color D. Now you use the upperside of block 2 to make your foundation row (such as a between square). Crochet your first stitch in the same stitch as the attachment!

If you crochet tightly then take a crochet hook larger or you can add an additional row in the middle! You do this by 2 times taking the same stich on of block 1.

### Block 4 10x10 Color A

This block will be made on block 2 and next to block 3. Attach to the upper rightcorner of block 2

Crochet completely in TSS tunisian simple stitch

## Block 5 10x10 Color C

This block will be made on block 3 and next to block 1. Attach to the upper rightcorner of block 3.

Crochet completely in TPS



Block 3 block 4 block 5

This is the first Discover-block. The tulip is for me the symbol of the Spring in the Netherlands.

This block will be made next to block 2 and 4. Attach at lower-right corner and make a chain of 30 stitches.

With this block you need to use the chart. You very first stitch you'll find in the lower-right corner. FR meansFoundation Row. You count from right to left, exactly as you crochet.

#### **Used Stitches**

TSS Tunisian Simple Stitch


TPS Tunisisan Purl Stitch

In order to clarify have the stitches their own color on the countinggraphic, **but you crochet it in one color!!** 

Watch at the attachment in block 2!!! At row 4, 8, 12 and 16 you must thread in at these rows in the same row of block 2.
