
# **Discover The Seasons – Week 18**

This week we reach the length of the blanket. It will be a tough week, because we are going to make 2 blocks with cables. I love knitted cables and thanks to Kim Guzman I found a way to make tunisian cables. Because I have limited tools, the first 2 blocks have a different chart. I'm still looking for free software which has all the tunisian stitches and the possibility of using cable stitches.

In the photo block 73 is Color C but it has to be color B




Block 71 30x30 Color B

With one of my favorites blocks we reach the length of the blanket. This block will be made on block 68/70. Attach at the right top corner of block 70.

This time I used a software program for knitting patterns to make the charts, that is why they look different and there will be some dutch behind the stitches. I also had no possibility of putting the numbers row next to the rows.

#### **Explanation Cable**

#### Cable to the left

You're making the cables in the return pass

step 1	pull <b>5 loops</b> of the hook. The first loop is your working loop, make this one larger and leave it										
step 2	pick up your stitch holder and pick up the loops which are close to your hook. Lay stitch holde										
	front of your work										
step 3	pick up the other 2 stitches with your crochet hook										
step 4	pick up the loops from the stitch holder onto your crochet hook										
step 5	pick up your working loop and make it normal size										
step 6	pull through 2 loops on the hook <b>twice</b>										
step 7	pull through 1 loop on the hook(a chain to give the cable some room)										
step 8	pull through 2 loops on the hook <b>twice</b>										

#### Cable to the right

pick up your working loop and make it normal size									
pull through 2 loops on the hook <b>twice</b>									
pull through 1 loop on the hook(a chain to give the cable some room)									
pull through 2 loops on the hook <b>twice</b>									




This block is a lot easier to make because there are only 2 cables in the beginning. When there are still problems I will go live on fb, so there will be an other movie.

This Block will be made on block 51, next to block 50/69. Attach on the right top corner of block 51.


#### **Stitches**

### **Explanation Cable over 6 stitches**

### Cable to the left

You're making the cables in the return pass

step 1	pull 7 loops of the hook. The first loop is your working loop, make this one larger and leave it
step 2	pick up your stitch holder and pick up the 3 loops which are close to your hook. Lay stitch holder in
	front of your work
step 3	pick up the other 3 stitches with your crochet hook
step 4	pick up the loops from the stitch holder onto your crochet hook
step 5	pick up your working loop and make it normal size
step 6	pull <b>3 times</b> through 2 loops on the hook
step 7	pull through 1 loop on the hook(a chain to give the cable some room)
step 8	pull 3 times through 2 loops on the hook



## The return pass is included in the chart

### ATTENTION!!!!!

In the chart are 2 extra columns. This is for the return pass only!! You have to make a chain at that position! In the forward pass you skip this stitch.



## **Description**

Follow the chart. The white spaces are no stitches, After the first cable you have to make the chain in the return pass.



# **Block 73 20x20 Color B**

## In the chart at page 1 block 73 is Color C but it has to be color B

This block will be made on block 53/54, next to block 72. count 30 stitches from the right top corner of block 54 and attach in the 31<sup>st</sup> stitch
